

Exhibition in Taiwan



23 mouth and foot painters from Taiwan took part in the exhibition marking the 35th anniversary of the Taiwanese publishing house.

The Taiwanese publishing house staged a major exhibition of its artists' works to mark its 35th anniversary. The opening took place on 5 August 2017. The paintings remained on display until 20 August 2017.

The Taiwanese publishing house celebrated its 35th anniversary this year. To mark the auspicious occasion, it staged a major exhibition at the Dr Sun Yat-sen Memorial Hall in Taipei, one which featured works by mouth and foot painters from Taiwan. They were certainly eager to be present at the opening of the exhibition and the Taiwanese publishing house had the honour of welcoming twenty-three of them. Numerous guests of honour were invited to this occasion, including Dr Frederick Chien, ex-president of the Control Yuan investigatory agency monitoring the Government, together with his wife; Mr Chen Xuesheng , Member of Parliament; Dr Kuang-shih Yeh, former transport and communications minister; and Professor Chuan Yi Tang, President of Providence University. At the opening ceremony, Dr Kuang-shih Yeh said: "I have already used the Christmas cards of the mouth and foot painters for a very long time. But today marks the first time that I have actually met them in person. I am deeply moved by their spirit." Other guests of honour were also delighted to take the opportunity and say a few words. Dr Chien encouraged the artists by referring to the quotation in the exhibition catalogue: «When God closed a door, he opened up a window somewhere else».

The German publishing house celebrated its 20th anniversary in 2017. Consequently, the annually held workshop in Potsdam marked this occasion.



CHINA

Huang, Guofu

Date of birth: 9 June 1970 Place of birth: Chongqing Mouth and foot painter Scholarship Holder since: 2015

Mr Huang Guofu was born in Chongging on 9 June 1970. In 1974, at the age of four, he lost both arms as a result of an electric shock. Despite these adverse circumstances, Mr Guofu completed his primary education, and after several years of self-study also completed his secondary education. At the age of twelve, on his own initiative, he began practicing how to paint and create calligraphy with his mouth. Mr Guofu had the honour of studying under master painters in his early years. In his twenties he studied under some very famous Chinese artists such as Wang Yiyang, Chen Mo, Hu Yichuan and Lin Chenghan, to name just a few. He was therefore able to learn several

different painting styles and is also familiar with brushwork as far as the ink and water painting technique is concerned. Mr Guofu's works are already being collected by hundreds of people, both in his home country and abroad. He had the opportunity to attend the 2010 World Expo in Shanghai and present a variety of his paintings. Many further exhibitions and awards testify to his incredible creative ability and drive. The artist's motifs are diverse and include, among other things, birds, animals, landscapes, and typical buildings in his hometown of Chingqing.


POLAND

Siejtbatalow, Walery

Date of birth: 8 June 1965 Place of birth: Denisovka (KZA) Painting method: Mouth painter Scholarship Holder since: 2012

Mr Walery Siejtbatalow was born in Denisovka, Kazakhstan, on 8 June 1965. He suffered a cervical spinal injury after jumping from a hill into a river and has been confined to a wheelchair ever since. In order to escape his immobility, he first began writing with a pen in his mouth. This subsequently led to him having the idea to use this method to paint and draw as well. He is a selftaught mouth painter who was first inspired by a colourfully illustrated children's Bible to draw motifs of Christ and other biblical scenes. In the following years, he expanded his art to glass window paintings and portraits of his

friends. Later on, he began using oil paints when painting. His first painting using this technique was an icon, and further award-winning icons soon followed. In recognition of his work, the artist was visited by the Archbishop Anthony of Ural and Guryevsk, during the course of whose visit he was permitted to receive a high religious order. Mr Siejtbatalow has held numerous exhibitions which have been held in high regard by the public. Important figures from his home country of Kazakhstan have repeatedly sponsored his exhibitions.

BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA

Sekulic, Mladen

Date of birth: 6 March 1990 Painting method: Mouth painter

Mr Mladen Sekulic was born on 6 March 1990 in Vlasenica, Bosnia and Herze-govina. He has suffered from arthrogryposis multiplex congenital since birth. He underwent five operations before his fifth birthday. All five operations were on his legs, from his heels to his hips. He attended primary school from 1997 until 2001, when he was forced to take a two year break due to his deteriorating health. Afterwards, he continued his primary education at a facility for the education and rehabilitation of disabled children and teenagers in Podgorica from 2003 until 2011. Mr Mladen Sekulic also completed middle school there. During his time at school in Podgorica he participated in all of the painting groups and workshops and took part in four group exhibitions. Upon completion of middle school he obtained the professional title of legal specialist. He paints motifs of his everyday surroundings in acrylic and coloured pencil.

CHILE

<u>Contreras Suarez,</u> <u>María Constanza</u>

Date of birth: 17 June 1983 Mouth and foot painter

Ms María Constanza Contreras Suárez was born on 17 June 1983 in Valparaíso, Chile. She was adopted when one month old by Jorge Contreras and Sabina Suárez because her birth mother abandoned her after the birth. Ms Suárez had both arms amputated and was also diagnosed with scoliosis and hip dysplasia. Because of her advanced scoliosis she was forced to undergo a series of complicated operations between the ages of four and thirteen. Since she learned to use the fine motor skills of her feet (of which she preferred to use her left foot for writing and drawing), her posture was badly impaired and her spine severely deformed. At the age of six, Ms Suárez began to attend primary school where she was encouraged to perform all kinds of activities with her feet. At the age of thirteen, she took part in a painting workshop run by the rehabilitation institute for children in Valparaíso where she was introduced to painting with acrylics and oil paints for the first time. She began to experiment with different self-taught techniques. She painted everything, from pastel paintings to graffiti on the wall of her own room. She began to experiment with mouth painting when working on the wall because up until that point she had only used her feet to paint. In 2011, she was granted the opportunity to paint the bodies of several students who were invited to attend a carnival celebration by the Chilean department of education. Since then she has also become recognised as a bodypainting artist and has been invited to paint actresses and other people on several occasions. Ms Suárez began working as a sociologist in a school in 2015.

COLOMBIA

Betancur Olave, César Augusto

Date of birth: 10 September 1978 Painting method: Mouth painter

Mr César Augusto Betancur Olave was born in Cali on 10 September 1978. He is the father of two daughters, the younger of which lives together with him. He was severely injured by a bullet which hit him in the neck during a street shooting. The bullet damaged his spinal cord which resulted in a loss of mobility in his hands and so he requires help with his daily life. In 2014 he became acquainted with the VDMFK Scholarship Holder Ms Maria Eugenia Reyes. She gave him painting lessons over the course of a year, and in this time he improved his painting technique. He paints his colourful subjects in oil.

Gonima Lopez, Angela Maria

Date of birth: 28 July 1950 Painting method: Mouth painter

Ms Ángela María Gonima López was born on 28 July 1950 in Medellín (Columbia). She was very shy and not very communicative during her childhood. She would often play alone, but she did find great joy in painting. Ms Ángela María Gonima López had a perfectly normal family and work life until she was involved in a serious car accident in 1983 The car overturned on the street and she was knocked against the windshield, which resulted in a C5-C6 injury of her spinal cord and made her a tetraplegic. It was at this moment in her life that she resolved to use her passion for painting to rehabilitate. She has painted under the guidance of VDMFK Scholarship Holders Mr Hernán Darío Vélez García and Mr Hector Jairo Tamayo Ospina since then. Her oil paintings are very colourful.

GERMANY

Mittelbach, Werner

Date of birth: 30 September 1959 Painting method: Mouth painter

Mr Werner Mittelbach was born on 30 September 1959 in Augsburg. After he finished secondary school he began an apprenticeship as a carpenter. In 1975, after a medical examination, it was discovered that he had an acute muscle weakness on the left side of his torso. After completing his apprenticeship and passing his master's examination he was forced to give up his work and apply for disability benefits at the end of 1984 due to health concerns. In 1991 he was diagnosed with spinal muscular atrophy

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(SMA), a genetic condition. Until the end of 2016, Mr Mittelbach painted and drew by hand. His arm strength and hand mobility steadily worsened over the years, which is why he began to experiment with mouth painting, starting in December 2016. He has only been able to paint with his mouth since then. Mr Mittelbach has been volunteering with an audit group for several years. The group works together with the district administrative office of Augsburg to advise communities in the district on the planning and building of streets and public buildings when it comes to accessibility. He prefers the mixed technique for his diverse motifs.

JAPAN

Tanaka, Junya

Date of birth: 27 January 1999 Painting method: Mouth painter

Mr Junya Tanaka was born in Iyo City on 27 January 1999. He was hit by a car in front of his house at the age of seven. All four of his limbs have been paralysed since then (C4 quadriplegic). On the advice of his primary school teacher, Mr Tanaka began to draw the Japanese characters with his mouth (calligraphy). This led to him beginning to paint with his mouth as well. He took painting lessons once a week. After graduating from school, Mr Tanaka started thinking about his future. He met Mr Fumiyuki Makino (a Scholarship Holder of the Association) at an exhibition. This encounter with the artist affirmed his decision to apply to the VDMFK. He makes use of diverse painting techniques in his varied motifs.

MEXICO

<u>Fontes Molina,</u> <u>Luis Rogelio</u>

Date of birth: 14 August 1988 Painting method: Mouth painter

Mr Luis Rogelio Fontes Molina was born in Chihuahua, Mexico, on 14 August 1988. He is the youngest of seven children and the father of a little girl. In 2008, at the age of 19, he suffered a spinal cord injury of the C4-C6 vertebrae. His stay in a rehabilitation centre helped him to find his way again. His two sisters have taken care of him since 2013. Thanks to an invitation from Ms Lidia de Jesus Chaidez Lopez (VDMFK Scholarship Holder), he learned of Paso Firme's Erich Stegmann painting workshop and began to take painting lessons there. Painting and his newfound friends have helped him look at his life more positively and increase his selfconfidence.

NEPAL

Lama, Amir

Date of birth: 3 March 2000 Painting method: Mouth painter

Mr Amir Lama was born in Kathmandu, Nepal, on 3 March 2000. He was born with arthrogryposis multiplex congenital. All four of his extremities were affected. Mr Lama is the oldest of three siblings. He is reliant on the help of his family as a result of his severe disability. In particular, his mother and grandmother take special care of him. Mr Lama attended five years of school. As a result of frequently being alone at home, he began to sing - and paint with his mouth. The Karuna Foundation in Nepal, a partner organisation of UNI-CEF, displayed interest in Mr Amir Lama and his talent after the powerful earthquake in Nepal in April 2015. They brought him to a hospital for medical examination and treatment. Based on the examinations, he was provided with a special cart. Thanks to this cart, he is no longer reliant on the help of his family the entire day. The Association has enabled Mr Lama to take singing and art lessons. He enthusiastically paints pictures of nature and landscapes of his homeland. His pictures were shown at an exhibition in May 2016.

NORWAY

Løseth, Wenche

Date of birth: 10 June 1960 Painting method: Mouth painter

Ms Wenche Løseth was born in Ulsteinvik, Norway, on 10 June 1960. As a young girl she was very active and involved in sports. She trained to become a technical draughtswoman. Ms Løseth went on to become an extremely busy professional woman and mother of three girls. Yet she had a serious stroke in 2000, resulting in the complete paralysis of her body. She is cared for at home by her mother. Wenche Løseth wrote a book with the title Tsunami in the Body, which came out in 2007. She began to paint in 2011. Ms Løseth has trained a great amount and can currently communicate with others through talking.

PHILIPPINES

Tongco, Julius

Date of birth: 27 November 1975 Painting method: Mouth painter

Mr Julius Tongco was born in Tagbilaran City in the Philippines on 27 November 1975. He graduated with a Bachelor of Sciences in Maritime Transportation in 1995. He was hired by the Eurasian Maritime Corporation in 1997. On 23 August 2004 he suffered a spinal cord injury in a diving accident. He has been paralysed from his shoulders to his feet ever since. During one of his visits to the orthopaedic hospital he saw a mouth painter practising his art. Mr Tongco wanted to do something which would allow him not to have to hide away from the public. His parents set up a small table in front of his wheelchair precisely for this reason, on which they arranged sheets of white A4 paper, coloured pencils, cheap brushes and a watercolour paint box for children. Mr Tongco finds inspiration for his paintings in nature.

POLAND

<u>Kropidlowska,</u> Marika Brygida

Date of birth: 19 March 2002 Painting method: Foot painter

Ms Marika Brygida Kropidłowska was born in Wałcz on 19 March 2002. She is in the second year of grammar school, where she is one of the best students. She gets good marks in her classes. She does well in competitions in which she participates and has won awards for them. Although she was born without arms, she is a girl who loves to laugh and is full of happiness. She has a very positive attitude towards people and the world. Marika is ambitious and conscientious. Some years of education still lie before her because a good education is very important to her. Her passions are painting and photography, and she dedicates every free minute to these two interests. She began painting

in her childhood, but is only now developing techniques, and she is experimenting with her painting.

RUSSIA

Papizhuk, Anastasiia

Date of birth: 8 August 1998 Painting method: Foot painter

Ms Anastasia Papizhuk was born in Ussuriysk, Russia, on 8 August 1998. She grew up without a father, and her mother died in 2007. On 14 April 2001 she was involved in a tragic accident at a transformer station where she lost both arms. Ms Papizhuk spent the years from 2006 to 2010 in an orphanage. As a teenager she regularly took Taekwondo lessons. With great ambition and joy she managed to gain a black belt. She participated in national and international competitions. Her greatest success was second place in the world championships as well as the title of the Russian vice-champion. Ms Papizhuk studied economics at the state university in Vladivostok. Her subsequent psychology and pedagogy studies at the Far Eastern Federal University came to an end after two successful years as a result of her pregnancy. In 2015 she gave birth to her son. She discovered painting during her recovery in the hospital. A doctor motivated her to write and draw with a pencil in her mouth. She is fully motivated in the further development of her painting talent. She prefers watercolours for her diverse motifs.

SINGAPORE

Tan, Janetta Si Ling

Date of birth: 15 September 1990 Painting method: Mouth painter

Ms Janetta Si Ling Tan was born on 15 September 1990 in Singapore. She was involved in a car accident on 19 February 2010. The driver had fallen asleep and crashed into the guardrails . The car spun a few times and overturned. She was the first one thrown from the vehicle and, as a result, she suffered a severe spinal cord injury of the C5-C6 vertebrae which left her paralysed from the chest down. Ms Si Lang Tan is a leftsided tetraplegic and permanently requires a wheelchair. She was in hospital for nearly a year, which forced her to interrupt her studies. In the middle of 2011 she decided to face her challenges and continue her Bachelor degree studies with a necessary scribe and special assistance from her university. At the same time she underwent physiotherapy at the Handicap Welfare Association (HWA), where she heard about mouth painting for the first time. Although she was completely interested in art, she knew very little about it at the time and her full school schedule kept her from exploring the subject fully. In 2014 she finally received her degree with honours in mathematics and economics. While she was being treated in physiotherapy, she met Mr Stanley Lim Min-Chieh (VDMFK Scholarship Holder), who was also being treated at the same facility. She came to know him better and was reintroduced to mouth painting. With his patience, guidance and sympathy, as well as the encouragement and support of her therapists and social workers, she took up mouth painting and found joy, peace and enthusiasm with each brushstroke she laboriously placed on the canvas.

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SOUTH AFRICA

de Beer, Catherine Lizette

Date of birth: 3 March 1976 Painting method: Mouth painter

Ms Catherine Lizette de Beer was born in Durban, South Africa, on 3 March 1976. She has been a tetraplegic since the car accident she had on 10 May 1997. After her accident she was first taken care of by her mother and then by her brother. She has lived in a residential care home since their deaths. In the care home she became acquainted with the now deceased VDMFK artists Scholarship Holder Mr Gert J.J. Olivier and Full Member Mr Justice May, who awakened her interest in painting. In 2011 she took art lessons for the first time. She prefers to paint her varied motifs with oil paints.

SPAIN

<u>Álvarez Rojas, María Paz</u>

Date of birth: 14 September 1961 Painting method: Mouth painter

Ms María Paz Álvarez Rojas was born with arthrogryposis on 14 September 1961. This illness affects the muscles and bones of the extremities. She learned from a young age how to make do with her mouth, and for her, her mouth is like her hands. She paints, writes and eats with it, applies makeup and can even operate her computer and cellphone with the help of a stylus. She has belonged to a theatre group since 1992 and has participated in over twenty productions. In 1989 Ms María Paz Álvarez Rojas began to paint with the support of an able-bodied friend who gave her painting lessons. She had already painted her first picture in 1991.

USA

<u>Bell, Donna</u>

Date of birth: 17 March 1964 Painting method: Mouth painter

Ms Donna Bell was born on 17 March 1964 in Port Sulphur , Louisiana. She grew up in Vidalia, Louisiana, where she also went to school. In the summer of 1979 she was riding in a car with her sister and a friend when they had an accident. She was the only one injured. Since that day she has been paralysed from the shoulders down (C3-C4). She spent some time in the Methodist Rehabilitation Center in Jackson. After some time at home, she tried to write her name with her mouth, and was positively surprised by the result. Ms Bell subsequently began to write letters to her friends and this led to her drawing and then painting.

Gregorich, Stephanie Anne

Date of birth: 7 February 1968 Painting method: Mouth painter

Ms Stephanie Anne Gregorich was born with arthrogryposis and scoliosis in Joliet, Illinois, on 7 February 1968. As a result of her condition, her limbs are stiff and immobile, and her bones and muscles severely weakened. She learned to write and paint with her mouth at a young age. Ms Gregorich graduated from Illinois State University with a Bachelor's degree in special education. After that she worked for 20 years as a private teacher and taught for three years at a primary school. Her interest in mouth painting was awakened when she saw a mouth painter of the VDMFK on TV. She is a self-taught painter. When painting, she feels a deep inner peace. She prefers to paint her varied motifs with oil paints.

VDMFK personalities

In this section we are honoured to introduce to you mouth and foot painters, who have rendered outstanding services to the VDMFK in the course of its over 60-year history. This time we present former Board Member Charles Pasche from Switzerland.

Board Member Charles Pasche passed away on 13 September 1981. He had served on the Board of the VDMFK since its inaugural meeting in 1956. Charles was born without arms in Céligny near Geneva on 11 October 1915. He learned to write the first few letters of the alphabet at school with his right foot. Charles attended an art school in the vicinity of Geneva. He became an acclaimed artist, whose agility and skill in using his toes exceeded that of more than a few fingers. The assuredness with which he used his feet to work on the writing and drawing board staggered everyone. Charles enjoyed painting still lifes of flowers and the magnificent alpine landscapes of Switzerland. He was able to present his works at numerous exhibitions in Switzerland and all over the world.



Charles Pasche from Switzerland was one of the founding members of the VDMFK. He was already voted onto the Board of Directors during the inaugural meeting, and remained a Board Member until his death in 1981.

CANADA

Guillemette, Michel

Date of birth: 27 March 1947 Passed away on: 22 April 2017 Painting method: Mouth painter

Having led a life like most other young people, Michel Guillemette had a diving accident, as a result of which he broke his spine and was left quadriplegic at the age of 19. After several years in a sanatorium, he became interested in a rehabilitation programme which enabled him to learn to write with his mouth. A therapist suggested that he tries painting. And so he discovered his talent, "which is going to enable me to live a more independent life later on," as he said at the time. In 1985, he turned to an art teacher, who taught him for five years and perfected his art. In 1987, he received a scholarship from the VDMFK. In 2004, he became a Full Member of the Association. Landscapes, which he mainly painted in oils, were Michel's preferred subjects. He managed to display his works at numerous public exhibitions. As a result, he

started to become more widely known. One of his greatest successes came about in 2000, when he received a request from the Canadian post office to paint a picture of the birth of Jesus, which served as a template for a Christmas stamp. In addition, he also held talks at schools, where he told his life story, hoping that this would help the pupils to build a better future for themselves. Michel Guillemette passed away on 22 April 2017.

NEW ZEALAND

<u>van der Hulst,</u> <u>Peter William</u>

Date of birth: 16 September 1956 Passed away on: 26 February 2017 Painting method: Mouth painter

Only two years after the birth of Peter William van der Hulst, his family emigrated from the Netherlands to New Zealand in search of a better life. After completing his school education, he worked as a diesel mechanic. In 1975, he suffered a serious traffic accident which left him paralysed down the neck. Consequently, he was confined to a wheelchair. At the beginning of the 1980s, he learned to paint with his mouth under the guidance and support of a number of art lovers. He was awarded a scholarship from the Association as early as 1982. About ten years later, he was awarded the status of Associate Member. He had been a Full Member of the VDMFK since 2000. Peter's favourite subjects for his oil paintings were the flowers and landscapes of New Zealand. Together with his wife, he travelled across the country to photograph various motifs. He then used the pictures in his studio as a template. In his later years he also became interested in portrait painting. Peter was a member of the Waikato Society of Arts and organised an annual exhibition in Hamilton, at which all of New Zealand's mouth and foot painting artists could exhibit their works. He frequently contributed to exhibitions throughout New Zealand by holding talks and painting workshops for schools and groups. Peter William van der Hulst passed away on 26 February 2017.

NEW ZEALAND

Hickey, Raymond

Date of birth: 29 October 1941 Passed away on: 5 August 2017 Painting method: Mouth painter

Raymond had a car accident which resulted in a spinal injury when he was 25. This left him completely paralysed, and forced him to spend several years in various hospitals as a result. He undertook his first attempts at painting during this period. The Association first awarded him a scholarship in 1990. Only four years later, he became an Associate Member of the VDMFK. In 2000, he was granted Full Member status. In his paintings, Raymond preferred to draw on motifs from the typical New Zealand landscape, which he depicted in an Impressionist style. In addition, he liked to paint flowers, portraits and, on occasion, the sea. In this regard he mainly used both oil and watercolour techniques. Painting brought him great success. For example, he participated among other things in a wide range of exhibitions, at which he frequently re-

ceived awards for his paintings. Furthermore, he regularly staged exhibitions with local artists from Howick. In addition to painting, Raymond was also interested in music. He composed music on his computer, which he also used for painting every now and then. Moreover, he always listened to music in the background while he painted, especially the music on his computer. Raymond Hickey passed away on 5 August 2017.

SLOVENIA

Mehle, Silvo

Date of birth: 17 May 1971 Passed away on: 16 January 2017 Painting method: Mouth painter

Silvo Mehle was born in Ljubljana on 17 May 1971. Silvo had been forced to live with the consequences of tetraplegia ever since he suffered a fracture and dislocation of his 3rd and 4th cervical vertebrae in a traffic accident which occurred in 1992. The accident left all his limbs paralysed. He began painting with his mouth under the guidance of Slovenian VDMFK Full Member Vojko Gašperut in December 2001. Silvo constantly managed to pursue his artistic career with great success and took enormous pleasure in his work. The Association first supported him as a Scholarship Holder in 2003. In 2011, he became an Associate Member in the VDMFK family. Silvo preferred painting in oils. Still lifes and landscapes of his homeland were among the motifs that he brought to his canvas. Silvo Mehle passed away on 16 January 2017.

In 1989, he suffered a serious circulatory disorder of the arms and legs and was no longer able to move his limbs. Due to his illness, he also had a ventilator which enabled his blood to circulate. Luis began painting with his mouth in September 1990. He taught himself how to paint. The Association first awarded him a scholarship in 1993. He had been a VDMFK Associate Member since 2011. Luis mainly preferred to paint in oils. His favourite motifs comprised the landscapes of his native Spain as well as people. Luis Lorenzo Navarro passed away on 21 March 2017.

AUSTRALIA

Swanepoel, Marion

Date of birth: 22 September 1943 Passed away on: 5 April 2016 Painting method: Mouth painter

Marion Swanepoel was born in Kent (England) on 22 September 1943. Marion taught at secondary schools and then decided to study biology at university. After graduating, she emigrated to South Africa, and later to Australia, where she taught biology. Her career came to an abrupt end when she was diagnosed with spinal muscular atrophy. In 1993, she became seriously interested in painting and was initially still able to paint with her hand. However, as a result of her disease, she was no longer able to use both hands and found herself confined to a wheelchair. Marion started out on her first attempts to paint with her mouth and taught herself to paint in 1994. The VDMFK first awarded her a scholarship in 1996. Her favourite motifs were taken from nature and also consisted of collages with pressed flowers on greeting cards. Marion's works were used for Christmas cards by the Paraplegic and Quadriplegic Association of South Australia over the course of eight years. She also participated in a number of exhibitions and received awards. Marion Swanepoel passed away on 5 April 2016.

ESTONIA

Samatauskas, Tarmo

Date of birth: 8 January 1988 Passed away on: 19 September 2017 Painting method: Mouth painter

Tarmo Samatauskas was born in Tallinn on 8 January 1988. During his final sixteen years of life, Tarmo lived in a little town by the name of Saue. When he was nine years old, he came across a group of drunken hunters. They confused him with a stray dog and fired shots at him. As a result, he was struck by bullets in his torso, head and neck. One of the bullets that hit his neck caused a severe trauma which resulted in paralysis (tetraplegia). Since his spinal cord was injured at the C4-C5-C6 level, he was unable to use his body from the shoulders down. Tarmo came across art for the first time during his rehabilita-

tion. One of his therapists told him to try drawing with his mouth. At the time, this was a great idea which immediately stirred his imagination. It also helped him strengthen his neck and shoulder muscles. After completing his rehabilitation, Tarmo began to draw again. Tarmo had also begun to paint a lot again in his spare time over recent years. Given that he had a lot of free time at home, it became an increasingly interesting activity for him – and, as he realised, a great therapy. It helped him calm down and have a focus in life. Consequently, it became his favourite pastime. In thinking about his future, he especially wanted to dedicate himself to art, drawing and painting, and find different ways and techniques for developing his skills. Tarmo Samatauskas passed away on 19 September 2017, only a few months after becoming a Scholarship Holder of the Association.

GERMANY

Illig, Michael

Date of birth: 7 April 1979 Passed away on: 12 June 2017 Painting method: Foot painter

Michael Illig was born in Tübingen, Germany, on 7 April 1979. After completing his secondary school education, Michael passed the journeyman's examination for the painting trade. In February 2002, he suffered severe open brain wounds and serious injuries to his face as well as other parts of his body in a traffic accident. This left him in a persistent vegetative state for years. The severity of his disability was 100%. For four years, he mainly painted in a square format with dimensions of 25x25 cm. As of spring 2009, he began painting in a larger format (40x40 cm) and on watercolour paper. Since his pictures relate stories and desires, he would chose entire sentences as the titles for his pictures. His other hobbies included playing Monopoly on the computer, listening to music and following his favourite football club, FC Bayern Munich. Above all, he wanted to

delight people with his pictures. The Association first awarded him a scholarship in 2010. Michael Illig passed away on 12 June 2017.

GREAT BRITAIN

Wood, Richard

Date of birth: 27 July 1970 Passed away on: 6 January 2017 Painting method: Mouth painter

Richard Wood was born on 27 July 1970. He became a tetraplegic as a result of a diving accident in 1991. During his rehabilitation, Richard began painting with his mouth and discovered how much he enjoyed it. Just one year later he was already taking painting lessons, which enabled him to make considerable progress. The VDMFK first awarded him a scholarship in 2000. Richard specialised in painting portraits and landscapes in acrylics. He staged successful solo exhibitions at the Burton Art Gallery in Bideford, Devon. Richard Wood passed away on 6 January 2017.

HUNGARY

Horváth, Károly

Date of birth: 22 April 1954 Passed away on: 15 February 2017 Painting method: Foot painter

Károly Horváth was born in Kalocsa on 22 May 1954. Károly contracted polio in 1956, which left his arms severely paralysed, though his legs slightly less so. He attended school through to the 8th class. Károly began learning about art in 1970 and took painting lessons from 1977 to 1980. Subsequently, he began painting with his feet in 1982. The VDMFK first awarded him a scholarship in 1994. Károly was able to take part in a number of exhibitions and also staged some notable solo exhibitions. His hobbies included watching television (sports programmes), videos and listening to music. Károly Horváth passed away on 15 February 2017.

JAPAN

Makino, Fumiyuki

Date of birth: 29 January 1966 Passed away on: 4 June 2017 Painting method: Mouth painter

Fumiyuki Makino was born on 29 January 1966. On 22 August 1982, Fumiyuki suffered an injury to the neck which resulted in his limbs being paralysed. He attended high school in the Okayama Prefecture, Japan and began learning how to paint in oils under guidance in 1985. The VDMFK first awarded him a scholarship in 1988. Fumiyuki painted with his mouth. He took part in exhibitions. His hobbies were listening to music and watching cartoons. Fumiyuki Makino passed away on 4 June 2017.

NORWAY

Johnsen, Ingeborg Alvær

Date of birth: 13 June 1950 Passed away on: 26 November 2016 Painting method: Mouth painter

Ingeborg Alvær Johnsen was born in Bergen on 13 June 1950. Having been born with AMC (arthrogryposis multiplex congenital), Ingeborg was unable to move her arms or legs. She began developing an interest in mouth painting in 2002 and always continued to teach herself from that time onwards. She became a VDMFK Scholarship Holder in 2006. The artist painted a wide repertoire of motifs, ranging from landscapes, flowers to still lifes. Ingeborg Alvær Johnsen passed away on 26 November 2016.

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SLOVENIA

Medved, Angela

Date of birth: 27 May 1932 Passed away on: 3 April 2017 Painting method: Foot painter

Angela Medved was born in Spodnje Jablane, Slovenia, on 27 May 1932. Both her arms had been paralysed since birth. Angela attended elementary school and began writing with her feet at the age of 10. She also learned to knit using her feet. With the help of a journalist who supported her financially, Angela was able to buy a knitting machine, which enabled her to make a living. She first became a VDMFK Scholarship Holder in 1986. Angela participated in a number of exhibitions in Slovenia and also excelled by staging a number of successful solo exhibitions. She also used her feet to work on tapestries, macramés, needlepoint tapestries, sewing and crocheting, and, what's more, taught herself to paint. Angela Medved passed away on 3 April 2017.

SOUTH AFRICA

Webster, Thomas Henry

Date of birth: 30 June 1949 Passed away on: 19 January 2017 Painting method: Mouth painter

Thomas Henry Webster was born in Johannesburg on 30 June 1949. In 1981, Thomas broke his neck in a diving accident. Afterwards, he lived in a care centre for ten years and worked for a computer company. In 1990, Annemarie Roos, an art teacher, encouraged him to learn painting and gave him private lessons. The VDMFK first awarded him a scholarship in 1995. Thomas preferred to paint landscapes and floral motifs. Thomas Henry Webster passed away on 19 January 2017.

SOUTH KOREA

Kim, Sung-Yae

Date of birth: 3 January 1947 Passed away on: 4 August 2017 Painting method: Mouth painter

Sung-Yae Kim was born in Cheongsong on 12 January 1947. She completed both her primary and secondary school education. Sung-Yae began suffering from rheumatoid arthritis at the age of 27. Her illness became dramatically worse, however, so that she was permanently confined to a wheelchair at the age of 30. Initially, she still painted with her hands. However, as her condition noticeably deteriorated, she was eventually no longer able to use her hands. She began to paint with her mouth in 1993. The VDMFK first awarded her a scholarship in 1996. Sung-Yae preferred to paint both in oils and watercolours. Sung-Yae Kim passed away on 4 August 2017.

USA

Maaele, Peter

Date of birth: 3 January 1978 Passed away on: 19 March 2017 Painting method: Mouth painter

Peter Maaele was born on 3 January 1978. Peter became a tetraplegic as a result of a boating accident which he had in 1999, when he tried to dive into shallow water for a dare. As part of his rehabilitation, he began painting with his mouth in February 2000. The Association first awarded him a scholarship in 2003. Since he had always been fascinated by the artistic genius of the concertos and symphonies of classical music composers and was already "musically active" before his disability, he began writing his own compositions. In painting and music he saw "infinite possibilities" which he enjoyed to the full. To briefly quote the mouth painter: "I was born a musician and have now learned to play again. Painting is as rejuvenating as it is therapeutic, and it reveals a talent that I have yet to develop and do not wish to waste." Peter Maaele passed away on 19 March 2017.

Simms, Perry

Date of birth: 29 August 1945 Passed away on: 5 May 2017 Painting method: Mouth painter

Perry Simms was born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, on 29 August 1945. A serious motorcycle accident in 1976 brought about a decisive turning point in his life. He came off from the road on his bike at high speed and was hurled about 50 metres into a group of trees, where he broke his C4 and C5 cervical vertebrae. The impact of the crash immediately left him paralysed. After his devastating accident, Perry attended a college and discovered his deep interest in anthropology, science and psychology. Moreover, he had always been fascinated by art and so he began painting with his mouth in 1977. The VDMFK first awarded him a scholarship in 2004. Perry Simms passed away on 5 May 2017.


Víctor Manuel Hernández Rico, publisher from Colombia, passed away in 2017.

What painting means to me

f truth be told, I hadn't given the matter much thought until now. So I didn't have an immediate answer ready to the question. But then, after some consideration, I realised what a huge influence painting has had on my life.

I've painted most of my life. In fact painting has become a good friend to me. It has offered me many opportunities. Some of them are obvious, such as the possibility to earn a living and express myself to the great big world out there. I think these important things also hold true for most art painters. As a mouth painter, I believe that we are obliged to face other challenges than the ones which ordinary art painters have to overcome in their careers. You could say that painting has a certain therapeutic value and helps us overcome the problem which we're confronted with as mouth painters. In this regard, painting has also helped me gain a lot of confidence and face life on fair terms. The ability

to paint and create works which people admire is one of the great gifts which painting has given me.



ife, with all its twists and turns, Lnever ceases to amaze me. In 1999 I met my wife Blance. That was one of the best things that ever happened to me in my life. We are now proud parents of twins, my son Pantelis and my daughter Alexandra. Each and every day is a blessing. When I see my children while I'm working, I realise just how much everything is connected. The journey I mentioned before continues and, although I don't know how my life would have been without painting, I am grateful that painting has been there in my life. Presentation of painting techniques

Arnaud Dubarre, VDMFK Scholarship Holder and mouth painter from France, reveals tips and tricks for mouth and foot painting.

Pastel painting

Presentation:

I paint by holding the brush and the other holders in my mouth. You can't hold the pastel directly in your mouth and you can't buy special holders, they're not available. So I've made some adaptations which I'd like to share with you.



Wooden clamp:



This clamp that I invented can be adjusted to fit most sticks, regardless of whether they are rectangular or circular.


This means that you can work on large surfaces with the long side of the pastel stick and also with the tip, so you don't need to change the holder.



Presentation of painting techniques

Precision clamp and crab clamp:

For more detailed work I prefer to go for the precision or crab clamp. These have the advantage that the pastel can be used up right to the end. They're available from any shop specialising in painting accessories.



Pencil or brush holder:

I have made a holder out of wood, which I use for pastel sticks as well as for brushes or rubber wipers.







Wiper:

You can't get around smudging in pastel painting. Most pastel painters do this with their fingers. After several attempts with my foot or the nose I found a stylus pen which fits perfectly. It has a soft end made of rubber which comes close to a finger's physical quality. The stylus pen is made by 'Bamboo' for use with tablets and mobile phones.





To sum up:

With a little practice, pastel is a nice material to work with. Even so, you must make a good sketch before applying the colour. Part 2 of the 'Health and care' section is by Lars Höllerer, Full Member from Germany.

'ROHO Quadtro Select' and medical sheepskin

We all know the problem. People who are paraplegic have little or no skin sensitivity. They feel only minimal pressure or no pressure at all on their bottom when they are in a wheelchair.

A "I sitting the right way? – How long can I sit for? For we'd prefer to leave even the most fantastic party that little bit sooner if we're not sure whether we've been sitting too long again.

The point is that an incorrect sitting position can cause the skin to redden, to swell or, in the worst case, to form a pressure point. Once this has happened, it's often quite tedious and laborious to stop the pinching and close the sore.

I've now been in a wheelchair for twenty-six years and have found myself asking such questions a lot of the time. Sometimes I sat on foam cushions, or on gel or air cushions in all kinds of shapes and sizes. Nothing really helped. So I often had to stay in bed because my bottom had reddened, or I had a skin irritation, or my scar, which had been caused by a pressure point, had come open again. Sometimes it was just for a day; but I could also end up spending weeks or months in bed at a time.

However, I've now finally found the best cushion for me. While trying yet again to test out a new seat cushion, I came across the 'ROHO Quadtro Select' (10 cm high) which I've been using for a good two years now.

The cushion itself has already been around for many years and is used by many wheelchair users here in Germany. It's designed for tetraplegic

people. For wheelchair users who are more agile (paraplegics), there's also the same cushion with a height of five centimetres. It's filled with a small air pump. When you sit on it, you let as much air out until your bottom has sunk well into the cushion. Then your carer only has to do a final check to see whether there's a gap of about two centimetres between your bottom (its lowest point, the coccyx) and the bottom of the cushion. That's the most comfortable way to sit.

But it was only by draping a medical Sheepskin over the 'ROHO Quadtro Select' that I could really feel the sensational effect. Now it's as if I'm sitting on clouds!

haven't had any more problems with my bottom since then. Even after thirteen hours in a wheelchair, my rear looks as if I had been sat straight into it. If you'd like to find out more, you can always send me an email (roll.on@t-online.de). I can then take even more photos or make a video about this.

History of the VDMFK

Lisbon 2002: 9th General Assembly

Eros Bonamini is elected President of the Association

64 Full Members and 38 Associate Members gathered from 21 to 26 October 2002 in Lisbon to hold the ninth General Assembly of the Association. The crucial agenda of this meeting focused on the election of the President, which was made necessary by the death of Marlyse Tovae, as well as elections to the Board. In accordance with the Articles of Association, the first ballot was held to confirm previous Board Members Ruth Christensen and Eros Bonamini in their office. Both were unanimously confirmed in their respective positions and thanked with great applause for the services they had rendered. In addition, a new election was due to be held for the two deceased Board Members Marlyse Tovae and Bruce Peardon. The Board recommended that Serge Maudet, a mouth painter from France, and Kunshan Hsieh, a mouth painter from Taiwan, be chosen as its new members. Both of them received a vote of confidence from the General Assembly and were elected unopposed to the VDMFK Board of Directors.


Subsequently, Full and Associate Members were asked to choose a successor to the late President, Marlyse Toyae. In a meeting held a few weeks prior to the General Assembly, the Board had decided to propose two candidates for the office of President to the General Assembly. The two candidates consisted of Eros Bonamini, a mouth painter from Italy, and Prof Manuel Parreño, a foot painter from Spain. After due consideration, however, Prof Parreño came to the decision that he would renounce his candidacy because he believed «that Mr Eros Bonamini is the stronger candidate to become President of the Associa-

tion», as he stated in a letter to the Board of Directors. At the General Assembly, interim President Dr Herbert Batliner declared that he had taken note of this letter with regret but that Prof Parreño's decision ought to be respected. Consequently, only Eros Bonamini was on the ballot paper for the election for President of the Association. This election itself was held in the form of a written ballot. Of the 96 votes cast, Eros Bonamini received 85. Thus he was elected third President of the Association of Mouth and Foot Painting Artists. The final ballot among the artists attending the General Assembly was held in order to confirm the Legal Consultant in his office. This they did by acclamation. As a result of the decisions taken by General Assembly in Lisbon, the Board was composed as follows: Eros Bonamini, President; Ruth Christensen; Prof Manuel Parreño; Serge Maudet; Kunshan Hsieh; Trevor C. Wells and Dr Herbert Batliner as Legal Consultant.

The VDMFK also held an international exhibition which was staged on the premises of the Portuguese Red Cross to accompany the General Assembly. 160 works by mouth and foot painters from 36 countries were presented to the public at large.

BRAZIL

- The Brazilian publishing house held an exhibition in São Paulo with works created by its mouth and foot painters. The vernissage was held on 23 January 2017 and the pictures were displayed at the Memorial da Inclusão, a museum set in one of Latin America's biggest cultural spaces. The paintings remained on display until 23 February 2017. Various artists gave painting demonstrations. The event lasted ten days and was held at various venues in Zurich. To finish off this series of presentations, the publishing house also hosted a short workshop in which German mouth painter and Full Member Mr Lars Höllerer as well as art painter Ms Edith Tarantino took part with demonstrations of their painting techniques in front of the assembled artists.

SLOVENIA

- The Slovenian publishing house staged its traditional exhibition at the Salus pharmaceutical's company hall in December 2016. This event was held in the form of a joint exhibition which explored the theme of the Magical Slovenian Winter. A total of 23 works were exhibited, which remained on display until 10 February 2017.

- The publishing house carried out a workshop for pupils on 13 December 2016. Over 650 children participated in the event. Nine mouth and foot painters demonstrated their painting skills. Some of the children also had a go at painting with their mouths.

MEXICO

- To mark the 60th anniversary of the Association of Mouth and Foot Painting Artists, the Mexican publishing house held a group exhibition in the Basilica de Santa Maria de Guadalupe, the largest Christian pilgrimage site in the world. The exhibition was opened on 4 May 2017 by Mexico's First Lady, Ms Angélica Rivera Hurtado. This signified a great honour and will remain an unforgettable moment for the 35 mouth and foot painters who were present. A total of 57 pictures were on public display until June 2017.
